

# THE RULES OF THE ROAD

A handy guide to the colors and shapes of traffic signage



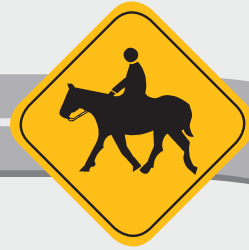
## RED AHEAD?

Hit the brakes! A traffic sign in red either signals you to stop your vehicle or prohibits entry and turns.



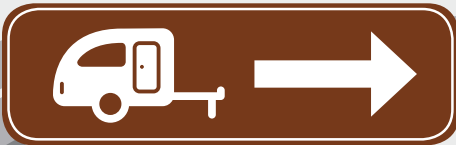
## TRUE BLUE

For motorist services like restaurants, gas stations, hospitals and hotels, look for blue signs.



## WHOA THERE!

A yellow-color sign indicates a general warning, such as: "No Passing Zone," "Sharp Curve" or "Pedestrian Crossing."



## BROWN IS FOR BREAKS, NOT BRAKES

Is there a scenic point of interest or a local recreation area ahead? A brown sign usually indicates a good spot for getting off the road for a bit.



## WHAT DOES GREEN MEAN?

Green means go! The color signals that you can proceed or provides you with a direction where to go.



## PAY ATTENTION ... OR PAY A FINE!

Traffic regulations are posted in black-and-white. Disregard one and you could be paying green!



## MEN & WOMEN AT WORK

You – and highway workers – will be a shade safer when you heed construction and maintenance signs, which are always in orange.



## 5 IS THE RULE FOR SCHOOL

A pentagon shape or five-sided sign signals there's a school zone ahead or a school-crossing nearby.
